


NLC618 Alarm Clock Radio with **Auxiliary Cord**

Thank you for your purchase of this quality clock. The utmost care has gone into the design and manufacture of your clock. Please read these instructions and store them in a safe place for future reference.

Controls

- 1. AUXILIARY Cable
- 2. ALARM 2 Button
- 3. ALARM 1 Button
- 4. TIME Button
- 5. POWER Button
- 6. MODE Button (Switches Between: FM > AM > AUX)
- 7. TUNING UP Button
- 8. SNOOZE/DIMMER Button
- 9. HOUR/VOLUME Button
- 10. MIN/VOLUME + Button
- 11. SLEEP Button
- 12. PRESET Button

Connecting to the Power Supply

Begin by plugging in the AC adapter into a standard household outlet.

Setting the Time

- While the radio is off, press and hold the **TIME** button down to activate time setting.
- While holding down the **TIME** button, press the **HOUR** button to advance to the correct hour. The PM indicator will light when the hour is advanced into PM time.
- While holding down the **TIME** button, press the **MIN** button to advance to the correct minute.
- Release the TIME button when the correct time is shown on the display.

Setting the Alarm

• To set the alarm time, follow the Setting the Time steps, using **ALARM 1/2** button, instead of the TIME button.

Using the Alarm Function

- Press the ALARM 1/2 button to select beep or radio and ALARM indicator will light up.
- The beep or radio will come on at the set time.
- To stop the alarm, press the **POWER** button. The alarm will sound again the next day.
- To turn the alarm off completely, press the **ALARM 1/2** button until the alarm indicator is no longer visible.

NOTE: While the beep alarm volume is fixed and cannot be adjusted, the radio alarm volume can be adjusted to your desired level using the **VOLUME** buttons. To select a radio station to wake up to, see the section on "Listening to the Radio".

Listening to the Radio

- Press the **POWER** button to turn on the radio
- Press the MODE button to select AM or FM band.
- Press and hold the **TUNING**> buttons to start automatic tuning up/down. Release the button when the unit is receiving a station you would like to listen to. For manual fine-tuning, you can press it briefly to adjust the frequency step by step.
- Press the **VOLUME** +/- buttons to adjust the volume level.
- Press the **POWER** button to turn off the radio.

FOR OPTIMUM RECEPTION:

In AM mode, orientate the unit to achieve optimum reception.

In **FM** mode, extend and position the FM antenna to achieve optimum reception.

The current time is always displayed. When you change to **RADIO** mode, the frequency will be displayed for 5 seconds and then the unit will go back to displaying the time.

Preset Radio Stations

You can store up to 10 stations for AM and up to 10 stations for FM.

- Use the **<TUNING>** buttons to search for a station. Press and hold the **PRESET** button to store the station and a number to be assigned for the preset.
- Press the <TUNING> buttons to change the number.
- Press the **PRESET** button again to confirm the preset.
- Repeat the above steps to store other stations.

LISTENING TO A PRESET STATION:

While listening to the radio, press the **PRESET** button to select a preset station.

Auxiliary Cord, Play your Music

- Connect the auxiliary cord to the 3.5mm jack of a music device e.g. MP3 player.
- Press the POWER button to turn on the radio & press the MODE button to select AUX mode & start playing the music device.

Snooze & Sleep Function

SNOOZE

• When the alarm sounds, press the **SNOOZE** button to pause the alarm, the alarm indicator will flash & sound again in 9 minutes.

SLEEP

- With this function you can listen to the radio up to 90 minutes, after which it will turn off automatically.
- Press the **SLEEP** button repeatedly to select the duration: 90, 60, 30 minutes or **OFF**.
- At the end of the set time, the radio turns off automatically.
- To cancel the sleep function before the end of the set time, press the POWER button to turn off the radio immediately.

Using the Battery Back Up

• Insert two "AAA" batteries into the battery compartment at the bottom of clock. The battery will keep the alarm and time settings until the power is restored. The LED display will not light-up but the alarm will sound at the preset alarm time. If there is no battery installed but the power is interrupted, the display will flash at 12:00 and the time and alarm need to be set again.

Battery Warning

- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.
- Follow the polarity (+) & (-) to place battery.
- Don't mix old and new batteries.
- Don't mix Alkaline, Standard (Carbon-Zinc), or Rechargeable (Nickel-Cadmium) batteries.
- Incorrect battery placement will damage the clock movement and battery may leak.
- Exhausted battery is to be removed from the product.
- Remove batteries from equipment which is not to be used for an extended period of time.
- Don't dispose of batteries in fire. Batteries may explode or leak.

Safety Instructions

- 1. Read these instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before this product is operated.
- 2. Keep these instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3. Heed all warnings All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. Follow all instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- 5. Do not use this apparatus near water The appliance should not be used near water or moisture for example, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, and the like.
- 6. Clean only with dry cloth.
- 7. Do not block any ventilation openings, Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 8. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.

- 13. Unplug the apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
